

The 1995 release of Foo Fighters' self-titled debut album began the ascent of Dave Grohl, Taylor Hawkins, Nate Mendel, Chris Shiflett, Pat Smear and Rami Jaffee to their current standing as the last great American arena/stadium rock band. Along the way they've won 12 Grammy Awards, sold tens of millions of records and spawned anthems like "This Is A Call," "Everlong," "Monkey Wrench," "My Hero," "Learn To Fly," "All My Life," "Times Like These," "Best Of You," "The Pretender," "Walk," "These Days," "The Sky Is A Neighborhood" and more. Foo Fighters' monolithic catalogue includes that eponymous debut, The Colour and the Shape, There Is Nothing Left To Lose, One By One, the epic double In Your Honor, Echoes, Silence, Patience and Grace, Wasting Light, Sonic Highways (which shared its title with the double-E Emmy-winning Dave Grohl-directed HBO docuseries), and 2017's international #1 Concrete and Gold, which included the Best Rock Song Grammy winner "Run." Having recently completed a 2017-2019 tour of the world's stadiums, arenas and festivals, Foo Fighters are currently hard at work on album number 10.
